



## **CONTACT US** if you have seen any of these possible violations:

- Use of animals for dissection or other classroom teaching purposes
- Animals who have been sickened or injured in experiments
- Animals in laboratories who are not receiving adequate veterinary care
- People who hit, screamed at or otherwise abused animals
- Animals who showed signs of distress (such as self-mutilation)
- Animals who are forced to live in small, filthy or dangerous cages (eg, with broken wires, etc)
- Animals who were given insufficient pain relief during or after painful procedures
- Animals who have gone without sufficient food or water
- Animals who were killed in painful ways (eg, mice whose heads were cut off with scissors, live animals who were placed in a freezer, etc)
- Animals who were used in experiments when non-animal alternatives were available
- Animals who were transported to a laboratory in an inhumane manner via truck, plane or ship

If you have seen any of these or any other inhumane conditions that you think may violate any guidelines, laws or regulations, please contact us — we will do everything we can to stop the abuse.
