

We have been working in India since January 2000 and have built up a wide network of activists and volunteers across the country. Here is a glimpse of what we have done in the past few years:

- PETA's documentation of cruelty and neglect at the National Institute of Virology in Pune prompted government authorities to seize 37 monkeys and two goats.
- Forty-nine lions and tigers were rescued from circuses across the country.
- PETA helped rescue six sloth bears who were being forced to perform on the streets. The sloth bears had ropes running through holes that had been burned into their noses.
- PETA was instrumental in rescuing 10 geese from two outlets and 123 animals from a school in Mumbai.
- As a result of a case filed by PETA, the Mumbai High Court ordered that the censor board cannot give certification to a film that has animals in it unless it obtains the requisite permissions from the Animal Welfare Board of India.

All the rescued animals mentioned above have been rehabilitated in safe places.

PETA works with celebrities to spread the message of compassion across India. Raveena Tandon, Hemant Trevedi, John Abraham, Mahima Choudhary and Amisha Patel, amongst others, actively support PETA in our vigorous campaigns. Pamela Anderson narrated a video spotlighting cruelty in the Indian leather trade. Because of our efforts, top leather officials are now pressuring the government to crack down on cruelty in the industry. PETA has also filed a case with the Supreme Court to push for kinder treatment of these animals.
